

EDUCATION AND TRAINING: AISWCD strives to provide members with opportunites for engagement, training, and professional development.


MEMBER SERVICES AND SUPPORT: AISWCD aims to provide SWCDs the resources and support needed to meet their conservation mission successfully.

SWCD S.T.A.R. PROGRAM

THE USE OF NO-TILL AND STRIP-TILL BY S.T.A.R. FARMERS ACCOUNTED FOR 3,374 TRUCKLOADS OF SEDIMENT KEPT OUT OF ILLINOIS WATERWAYS, OVER 15,000 POUNDS OF PHOSPHORUS KEPT IN THE FIELD AND THE CARBON DIOXIDE EQUIVALENT OF REMOVING 6,730 PASSENGER CARS FROM THE ROAD FOR A FULL YEAR.
